




Evolution of the Profession

1.6% increase in practicing registrants compared to previous year


Our Numbers: Practicing Registrants

Our Numbers: Nurse Practitioners




14.4% increase in number of NPs compared to previous year

Demographics: Age




Demographics: Education





Evolution of the Profession

National Nurse Practitioner Regulations Practice Project

The Canadian Council of Registered Nurse Regulators (CCRNR) moved forward this year with a multi-year, multi-faceted initiative for NP Regulation. This national project builds upon CCRNR's previous work with a goal to implement a Model for NP Regulation in Canada and includes:

- o Entry level education programs
- o Entry level examination
- o Standards of Practice
- o Continuing competency requirements
- o Registration renewal
- o Re-entry to practice

RN Prescribing

RN prescribing is moving forward in NL. Regulations governing RN prescribing to be drafted by the Provincial Government.
